

ICD-10 Coding Reference Sheet

Chronic Venous Insufficiency (CVI)	I87.2
Wound/Chronic Dermal Disruption	See list below
Post-mastectomy Lymphedema	I97.2
Acquired Lymphedema	I89.0
Primary (Congenital) Lymphedema	Q82.0
Lymphedema due to complications from surgical procedure	I97.89

Wound/Chronic Dermal Disruption

Wounds are now classified with increased specificity according to three criteria: [a] location on limb, [b] side (right/left), and [c] severity. L97 means the wound is a non-pressure chronic ulcer. The digits after the decimal specify location, side, and severity, as follows: L97.[a][b][c].

ICD-10 Location Values:

- 1 = thigh
- 2 = calf
- 3 = ankle
- 4 = heel/midfoot
- 5 = other part of foot
- 8 = other part of lower leg
- 9 = unspecified part of lower leg

ICD-10 Side Values:

- 1 = right
- 2 = left
- 0 = unspecified

ICD-10 Severity Values:

- 1 = limited breakdown of skin
- 2 = fat layer exposed
- 3 = necrosis of muscle
- 4 = necrosis of bone
- 9 = unspecified

If you are getting a handwritten prescription from a doctor, please request they write on the Rx the location of the wound and which leg it is on (per above) – we can just use the unspecified severity code.

Examples: Right ankle wound is written on the Rx. Code = L97.319. Left toe wound is written on the Rx. Code = L97.529.
